MARCH IS EPILEPSY AWARENESS MONTH IN EDMONTON



March is Epilepsy Awareness Month across Canada. The Edmonton Epilepsy Association (EEA), is proud to be the key leader in awareness, education, and support for Epilepsy across northern Alberta!

Epilepsy, a neurological condition that affects 1 in 100 Canadians, with over 20,000 people diagnosed each year across Canada. Misfirings in the brain's electrical currents cause seizures, and anyone can develop Epilepsy at any time, from children, to adults, from genetics, to other diseases, to brain injuries. Strokes can trigger the onset of Epilepsy.

Although living with Epilepsy can be difficult, it is not a barrier to achievement. Many great people in history have lived with Epilepsy and many famous people, in all areas of life, live with Epilepsy and thrive in their own way! However, Epilepsy remains a mysterious condition, which often scares people and carries a stigma of disability and isolation. Epilepsy carries the added disadvantage of often being an "invisible disability", which is harder to explain and teach about to the community, and impacts those who live with it, adding isolation, shame, and fear.

The <u>EEA</u>, a registered charity since 1960, remains the only Agency providing educational and awareness programs, as well as support services to the more than 20,000 individuals living with Epilepsy in greater Edmonton, Northern Alberta, and the N.W.T. Our key programs include a series of Epilepsy Information Booklets, freely available to all, online and in print, as well as a free live puppet show called <u>Kids On The Block</u>, which teaches students in elementary grades what it feels like to live with Epilepsy.
